

## 2024-2025 NATIONAL TEAM AND AAP NOMINATIONS

Congratulations to the Athletes who have been nominated and selected to the National Team based on the criteria outlined in the [Ski Jumping Canada National Team Selection Process & Criteria 2022/2023](#) and will be nominated to Sport Canada to receive AAP carding under the [Ski Jumping Canada Carding Policy 2024/2025](#). All nominations and selections were reviewed and supported by the High Performance Committee (HPC).

### Selection Rational

- The goal of the National Team and AAP selection criteria is to select athletes who demonstrate the potential for a podium performance and contribute to Canada's nation cup points.
- AAP carding type nominations are not finalized and subject to change upon review and acceptance by Sport Canada.
